


What are the STEMpact Pathways?

There are three STEMpact pathways once a student has graduated from a STEM Academy at one of the Oxnard Union High School District (OUHSD) high school partners:

- Enrolling at Oxnard College and then transferring to CSU Channel Islands (CI); OR
- Enrolling at Oxnard College; OR
- Enrolling at CSU Channel Islands as a freshman.

Science Technology Engineering Mathematics

What is STEMpact?

STEMpact supports Ventura County students in pursuing a Science, Technology, Engineering, or Mathematics (STEM) major in college.

STEMpact seeks to make attending college an attainable goal for every student. The program guarantees admission to Oxnard College and/or CSU Channel Islands for students who have committed to studying STEM and who complete minimum college preparatory requirements.

Benefits of STEMpact

- Academic coaching and peer mentoring by college students,
- College admission and financial aid information sessions,
- College preparation guidance to students,
- Academic advising and major-specific education plans,
- Enrollment in a college success first-year experience,
- Transfer workshops, and
- Guaranteed admission to Oxnard College or CSU Channel Islands.

Oxnard College Promise

In addition, Oxnard College provides a Promise Program that includes tuition-free first year, expanded college orientation, and priority registration. Students enrolled in the Oxnard Promise are placed in the First Year Experience Program along with specialized academic support programs. Eligibility for the Oxnard Promise consists of the following:

- Recent high school graduates of Oxnard Union High School District (including Santa Clara High School)
- Complete the Oxnard College application online
- Submit the OC Promise application
- Complete the FAFSA or Dream Act Application
- Complete the BOG Fee Waiver Application
- Complete: (1) an assessment for course placement; (2) college orientation; (3) an abbreviated educational plan with a counselor
- Participate in academic counseling (1/semester)
- Full-time (minimum 12 unit) student schedule



What Commitment Does a Student Have to Make to STEMpact?

Students in 8th grade must commit to one of the below STEM Academies at Hueneme or Channel Islands High School and must declare that they intend to commit to being part of STEMpact at the time they commit to an academy:

- Marine Science Academy and Mechatronics Engineering Academy, Channel Islands High School
- Academy of Engineering and Design, Hueneme High School

STEMpact requires students to commit to one of the three STEMpact Pathways that involve enrollment as a student at either Oxnard College or CSU Channel Islands. The commitment to being part of STEMpact will be renewed in the student's junior year.
